Summer Series 2006

What is an Ideal Time?

The BOF ranking list uses the concept of an Ideal Time for each class at a Ranking Event. It is defined as the theoretical time that the best British orienteer in the age group, performing normally, would take for the course on the day.

The method of calculating this Ideal time is detailed in Appendix A.3.3 of the Rules and is so fiendishly complicated that it is always left to a dedicated computer. This time is not even published. It is merely fed into another calculation to determine each competitor's ranking points.

Now, with electronic punching and the publication of every competitor's splits on the web, it is easy to sum the best splits for each leg and arrive at an alternative Ideal Time. Thus, there can be an Ideal Time for non Ranking Events too.

So why not calculate your percentage behind the Ideal at each event

$$(\text{your time} - \text{ideal time}) \times 100 / \text{ideal time}$$

and plot a graph of your performances.

Don't be discouraged by large figures. On the Green course at Shotover, even the winner was 11% adrift

While the memory of an event is still fresh in your mind, making use of the published splits in this way should also help in identifying situations where adopting a different strategy next time might be a good idea.

Planners Comments

I tried to keep the courses varied but also trying to avoid having too many loops going where you've been before, just because you can with electronic punching.

On the morning of the event we discovered that two controls had been vandalised but were corrected before the first starts. When collecting controls we discovered a further three more controls had been vandalised but fortunately this had occurred after all competitors had finished their runs and the only people inconvenienced were Mark and myself as we searched for 120 in the thunderstorm that had come over later in the afternoon. I propose that perpetrators, when caught, be given community service and made to gilly for planners. Carrying twenty stakes across the map should soon rehabilitate them.

Luckily you all escaped the rain but this brings me to mention a strange coincidence; in all of the visits I made to Black Park prior to the event it rained except when Mike was there. On the day of the event we had blue skies right up until half an hour after Mike left. Truly, the sun shines on the righteous!

Thank you to Mike and Lynda for their advice and checking, to Andrew Chalmers for his work on the map and for scrambling through the green walk area to the north-east of the finish to add some new features in and thanks also to the TVOC control checking team who patiently waited whilst I returned from the north-east end of the map before collecting controls.

Proposal for a TVOC Saturday Series of local events.

Introduction

Many of the surrounding clubs organise a series of Saturday local events offering a limited number of colour coded courses. This is to encourage participation at all levels- for beginners, people who would like to improve, and the more competent orienteers who would like a local run on Saturday. Given the age profile of our sport, this is absolutely essential if we are to attract newcomers to the sport.

Electronic punching is used at all the events. Competitors without their own dibbers can hire them at registration. All events are CATI (Come and Try It) so everyone is welcome. Club members are on hand to give newcomers advice and assistance.

A key success factor with other clubs is the use of good quality areas. These don't have to be large areas. Indeed this is an excellent use of smaller areas not suitable for district events.

At the club meeting on 28th March 2006 it was agreed to set up a Saturday series running from September 2006 to April 2007. If this is successful, we would then carry on into the 2007/8 season. I volunteered to co-ordinate the series.

There are a number of clubs from surrounding areas, which offer local Saturday events.

SN Junior League Events

Running since 1986, there are 8 monthly events from September to March, mostly on the first Saturday of every month (5 out of 8 last season). Registration opens 9:45 and closes 11:15, with starts between 10:00 and 11:30. The finish closes at 13:00. There are 4 courses set at every event; yellow, orange, light green and a short blue. Entry fees are SN adults £3, other adults £4, juniors £1.50, and £5 family groups.

Attendance has been 160 to 190 over the last 7 events. Details can be found on the SN website: http://www.geocities.com/southern_nav/school.html

BKO Saturday Morning Local Events

Results for Saturday events are listed from Oct 2003. There is approximately one event each month with 6 events from October through to April. The events are scheduled on varying Saturdays through the season. Registration is open from 10.00 to 11.00, with starts from 10.30 to 11.30 Courses offered are normally White, Yellow, Orange and Light Green. The cost is £3.00 for seniors and £1.00 for juniors. HH Saturday Orienteering Series

The Hertfordshire Orienteering Club organises a Saturday Orienteering Series of small scale events for new orienteers and club members from October to June, which run on the first Saturday of each month. Costs are seniors £3.00, juniors £1.50, and HH members (juniors and seniors) £1.00. Courses offered are:

Beginners Course – around 2 km (yellow standard)
Intermediate Course – around 3 km (orange standard)
Advanced Course – typically 45 minute Score Course or sprint (light green, light green plus extension).

All the events run from 10:00 and 11:00.

Attendance has been 70 to 160 over the last 5 events. The average is well over 100.

THE PROPOSAL

I propose TVOC offer a series of approximately monthly local (CATI) events starting from September 2006 and running through to April 2007 (aiming for a minimum of 6 events in total). As most of the clubs offer fixtures on the first Saturday of each month, I suggest we go for the third Saturday in each month. Fixtures will have to be coordinated between local clubs to ensure clashes are minimised. In addition it might be sensible to co-ordinate with our normal fixtures programme.

I propose to offer 4 courses: yellow 2km, orange 3km, light green 3km, light green plus extension 5km (if possible the extension should include a few TD5 controls for the more experienced orienteers).

Registration: 10.00 until 11.00

Starts: 10.30 to 11.30

Courses close 13.00.

Suggested costs are £3 adults, £1 juniors and TVOC members.

Organisation

There will be a co-ordinator for the series responsible for appointing organisers, co-ordinating fixtures with other clubs and giving help and advice where required.

These will be low-key events organised in a similar style to the summer series except with electronic (EMIT) punching being used where possible. Registration will be one or two people in cars taking names. The Start and Finish will consist of banners plus an EMIT control unit, with the Start manned by a single volunteer. Download will be a portable EMIT unit with a mini-printer. The results can then be posted on the web page. We should aim to provide bagged overprinted A4 maps (laser printed). John Farren offered to help with printing the maps. Jim Prowting has suggested an OCAD8 training session to teach planners how to use OCAD to overprint maps with courses, and post control descriptions on the map. It must be simple even I can do it!

The target audience would be kids and their parents, perhaps through schools. I expect 10-20 people at the first events, hopefully increasing to 60 plus at the end of the season as word gets around.

An organiser will be responsible for putting on individual events:

- Obtaining permission (Paul Greenough has offered to provide contact details),
- Planning the courses,
- Getting volunteers for help with registration, Start, download, and collecting controls afterwards.

I've already coerced a few volunteers but this will not work unless you come forward. Indeed if we have the volunteers we can run the series throughout the summer (2007) as well. This is a great opportunity for first time planners and I will gladly act as controller should you require one. I can also help with the OCAD side of things. So, when you do come to plan a district or regional event you'll have no worries.

In addition, I would welcome any feedback on this proposal. Thanks.

As you will see, the job required 30 people working full time for two days! Even so that did not include preparation of the final results as computers were beginning to help. I seem to remember after even earlier events, spending evenings, along with many other members, compiling results lists by hand, which then had to be typed on to a stencil and gestetnered off, the sheets stapled together and finally put into the post.

Despite all the rude things I frequently say about computers I suppose they are not entirely bad!

RESULTS - J.K. 1982

Thank you for agreeing to be part of the results team at JK'82. At least it is a sitting down job, starting at a civilised hour and under cover! The first start time is 9.50, so we need to be ready to start work at 10.30 am. We should be finished by about 6 pm each day as courses close at 4.30 pm. Final preparation of the results will be by computer and will not be our responsibility. Our team will be organised as follows:-

- Two people. Receive control cards, sort into 6 colours, file in boxes, most recent arrivals at back, work from front, distribute to tables.
- Six tables x four people on each dealing with not more than 500 cards at each table

A subtracts on control card and transfers times to stub.

B cuts off stub, sorts control cards into courses, puts in boxes, most recent arrivals at the back.

C checks punches, working from the front of boxes. If correct, tick in marked space on card (PUNCH ___ TIME). Ring any wrong punches and put card in queries box.

D checks each card against start list and crosses off finishers,

(depending on the 'mix' of classes it would be possible at some tables for each person to do all four jobs for one (or two) courses. All the work on each group of 500 or less cards being done by a small compact team of four working together makes flexibility of this sort possible without affecting the procedure on the other tables. Each table will be coping with either 4 or 5 courses incorporating between 5 and 9 classes)

- Two people. One collecting stubs from tables, the other sorting them into classes on a "chess board" table in the order in which they will be displayed, for collection by display team.
4. Two people (Alastair Moir/Geoffrey Geere). Dealing with queries, trouble shooting and generally avoiding the actual work.

RESULTS TEAM VENUE

Day 1 - A room in the Bracknell Sports Centre (175/872677) signposted as the Event Centre from the town centre.

Day 2 - A marquee at race site (175/888629) signposted, from A30 between Camberley and Bagshot. From Event Centre take A322 to Bagshot, then A30 towards Camberley. 500m after Jolly Farmer roundabout turn right by Fire Station. From Reading take A327 and turn left along A30, turn left just before Fire Station.

PLEASE BRING WITH YOU

- Food and hot drinks for yourself for the whole day.
- A pen - biro or spirit. Scissors - only one is essential at each table.
- On Day 2 when we will be in a tent - very adequate warm clothing according to the temperature. Bear in mind that we shall be just sitting for a long time. If it is very cold, an old sleeping bag to sit in might be a good idea.
- On Day 2 only - your own chair please. Camping chairs are likely to be best as the ground may be rough, but they tend to be low for working at a trestle table so a cushion may help. If you have a spare chair you can easily bring with you, this may be helpful if we find it necessary to supplement our team with volunteer help on the day.
- If you have a camping table, which is no trouble to bring with you, it might be helpful.
